



# Grandma's Favorite Garden Path

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Spring 2022 Mystery Quilt Class

## Step One

Quilters,

This Spring's Free Zoom Mystery Quilt class... *Grandma's Favorite Garden Path*, starts Monday, February 7, 2022, at 7:00PM (CST).

[NOTE: I am in the Central Time zone; be aware that the class may begin an hour or two earlier or later for you, depending on the time zone in which you live! A copy of the Zoom Link is included at the end of this PDF.]

I will be presenting Fabric and/or Scrap selection first, and then instructions on Block A. Some of you may be using yardage and hopefully, many of you will try your hand at using up your scraps! I will demo blocks using yardage and using scraps, so you'll get a few ideas for how you plan to create your beautiful Mystery quilt!

So, for those of you using your "Speedy Solutions Scrap Stash!" here are the size/values of scraps you will need for the quilt: (Note: I am still using the colors (that I showed in the Introductory PDF) next to the values below to help you identify them in the block as we work... your 'colors' may be different than mine.)

## **Block A Instructions: *Grandma's Favorite* Block**

This block is a simple block created from HST's and 2-patches, along with a center square. It goes together in a 9-patch fashion.

We'll start by making the HST units; then the 2-patch units.

**To make the HST units** (using my Speedy Solutions Techniques!) I simply grab two squares – in this case a Dark #1 (Purple) and a Light – in a size that is LARGER than the FINISHED HST will be. For this quilt pattern, we will use 4" squares...

Place a 4" Dark #1 and a Light square RST.

Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner.

Sew a SCANT ¼" seam allowance on EACH side of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn line.

Press open; always press toward the dark whenever possible throughout the Mystery Quilt.



**Using a square-up Ruler, Square up EACH HST to 3.5".**

For the Wall quilt, you will use 32 sets of Dark & Light squares together to end up with 64 HST units.

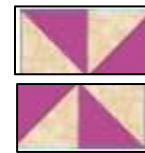
For the Queen quilt, you will use 96 sets of Dark & Light squares together to end up with 192 HST units.

Next, let's sew (2) HST units together as shown in the diagram.

Then sew (2) rows of the HST's together to form a Pinwheel!

Be sure to orient the HST units correctly as you sew them together.

"Nest" the center seams so the center points lie flat.



**Square up each Pinwheel unit to 6.5"**

**Now let's create the 2-patch units.** Sew a Light 3.5" square to a Med #1 (Green) 3.5" square. Make (16) 2-patch units for the Wall size quilt and (48) 2-patch units for the Queen size quilt.

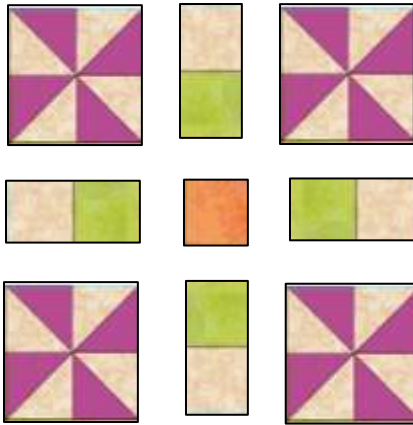


(The 2-patch units should measure 3.5" x 6.5" when pieced together. Check each 2-patch unit to make sure it does.)



Next, let's lay out our block in a 9-patch fashion and sew it together. I like to "web" my blocks and quilts together as I piece them. You can watch my video on this technique by clicking this link: <https://quiltingwithlori.com/how-to-web-a-quilt-block/>

NOTE: Be sure to ORIENT each 2-patch correctly within the three rows.



Sew Rows as follows:

Row One: Pinwheel; 2-patch; Pinwheel

Row Two: 2-patch; 3.5" Med #2 (Orange); 2-patch

Row Three: Pinwheel; 2-patch; Pinwheel

For the Wall Quilt, make (4) Block A's [Grandmother's Favorite].

For the Queen Size Quilt, make (12) Block A's [Grandmother's Favorite].



**Square up EACH Block A to 15.5"**

You are now ready to work on the next Block! See you next week!
