Finished Block size: 12" x 12"

With all my Mystery Quilt classes, you can use your scrap stash! For those of you who may not have your scraps cut, organized & ready to use, watch my video (link <u>HERE</u>) which teaches you how!

Due to the wonderful response to this class, I must split up the Zoom classes into two slots each Monday evening in October. I have 100 Zoom slots available PER CLASS, so I've split up the sessions using the Mississippi River as the dividing line for students in the USA. I've also identified (below) which time slot to use if you live in Canada, England, Germany, or Australia!

Please note that I live in the Chicago-land area which is Central Standard Time Zone (USA), or UTC-06:00, so the times given below are Central Standard Times (CST in USA).

Be sure to determine what time it is in **your Time Zone based on Central Standard Time...** (i.e. EST = one hour ahead of CST; MST = one hour behind CST, etc., etc.)

<mark>If you live <u>EAST</u> of the MISSISSIPPI River</mark>, or in <mark>Ontario, Canada</mark>, jump on the Zoom call <mark>at <u>7PM</u> **Central Standard Time**.</mark>

If you live <u>WEST</u> of the MISSISSIPPI River, or in Alberta or British Columbia, <mark>Canada,</mark> jump on the Zoom call at <u>8:15PM</u> Central Standard Time.

If you live in <u>Europe or Australia</u>, you are welcome to jump on the call at 7PM (USA) **Central Standard Time**, OR, you may prefer to simply watch the tutorial video at a more convenient time for you! I will place each video out on my website after each class takes place.

ALL students will be able to watch each step of the Mystery Quilt Class out on my <u>website</u> **AND** on my <u>YouTube Channel</u>. So, even if you miss a class or two, no worries! You won't miss a single thing because you will be able to watch the videos over and over at your leisure. The PDF's will also be posted out on my website, as well as on the corresponding YouTube videos.

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Fabrics required:

Dark Fabrics: 1 ½ yards Medium Fabrics: 1 ½ yards Light: 1 3/8 yards

Backing: 3 ½ yards Binding: ½ yard

<u>Fabrics for the Quilt:</u> Cut from yardage or Pull from Scrap Stash:

For Block A:

Dark Fabrics: (8) 4.5" squares; (32) 2.5" squares
Mediums Fabrics: (32) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles [Or, pull (16) 5" squares & trim ½" off one side and cut each resulting square into (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles for a total of (32) rectangles.]
Light Fabrics: (32) 2.5" squares
HST's: (32) 3" squares Dark and (32) 3" squares Light
Flying Geese Units: (16) 4" Medium squares; (32) 3" Light squares

For Block B:

Darks fabrics: (80) 2.5" squares Medium Fabrics: (64) 2.5" squares Light Fabrics: (80) 2.5" squares HST's: (32) 3" Light squares; (32) 3" Dark squares

For Corner Border Blocks:

Dark Fabrics: (4) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles [Or, pull (2) 5" squares & trim ½" off one side and cut each resulting square into (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles for a total of (4) rectangles]; (4) 2.5" squares; (8) 1.5" squares **Light Fabrics**: (8) 1.5" squares

For Border Blocks:

Dark Fabrics: (192) 1.5" squares
Medium Fabrics: (48) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles [Or, pull (24) 5" squares & trim ½" off one side and cut each resulting square into (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles for a total of (48) rectangles]
Light Fabrics: (192) 1.5" squares




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Directions:

Block A: (Make 8 Blocks)

Create HST's using the 3" Lights & 3" Darks. Place a Light & Dark square RST; draw a diagonal line across the square; sew scant ¹/₄" SA on EACH side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line. Press toward the Dark seams. **SQUARE UP each HST to 2.5"**. Make a total of (64) HST's.





HST 4-patch Units: Create 4-patch units using (2) HST's, a 2.5" Dark square and a 2.5" Light square as shown in photo at left... be sure to orient the HST units in the correct position to create the 4-patch unit correctly. Make a total of (32) of these 4-patch units for the quilt. **Square**

up HST 4-patch units to 4.5".

Flying Geese Units: Cut each of the (16) 4" Medium squares on the diagonal once to create a total of (32) Larger Base Triangles for the base of the Flying Geese unit. Then, cut each of the (32) 3" Light squares on the diagonal once to create a total of (64) Smaller Triangles.

Sew the smaller triangles on each side of the Larger Base Triangle, as shown in photo (right). Square up EACH Flying Geese Unit to 2.5" x 4.5". Make a total of (32) Flying Geese units. **Square up each to 2.5" x 4.5"**.



To complete the Flying Geese unit, sew a 2.5" x 4.5" Medium Fabric

rectangle to the bottom of each of the (32) Flying Geese patches as shown at left. Square up each completed Flying Geese unit to 4.5" square.



Layout Block A as follows:

Row One: HST Unit; Flying Geese Unit; HST Unit





Row Two: Flying Geese Unit; 4.5" Dark square; Flying Geese Unit. (Be sure to orient EACH of the Flying Geese units in the correct position.)

Row Three: HST unit, Flying Geese Unit; HST unit.

Sew the (3) rows together for each block.

Square up each Block A to 12.5" square. Make a total of (8) Block A's.
