### **Border Blocks**

**Dimensions** of Quilt: 58" x 58" **Finished Block size**: 12" x 12"

#### Hi, Quilters!

Do you have your (8) Block A's & (8) Block B's finished (Weather Vane & Sedona blocks)? I look forward to seeing your finished blocks during the call on Monday evening! Thank you so much for sharing your blocks, quilts and anything 'quilting-related' on my Facebook Group Page: Monday Night Mystery Quilt!

With all my Mystery Quilt classes, you can use your scrap stash! For those of you who may not have your scraps cut, organized & ready to use, watch my video (link HERE) which teaches you how!

NOTE: The Zoom Classes for Monday, Oct 17 will be held at 7:00 PM CST (Central Standard Time). There will only be one class that evening & everyone who plans to jump on the call will do so at 7:00PM CST. (So, be sure to determine what time it is in YOUR time zone BASED on Central Standard Time.)

#### Fabrics required:

Dark Fabrics: 1 ½ yards Medium Fabrics: 1 ½ yards

Light: 1 3/8 yards

Backing: 3 ½ yards Binding: ½ yard



**Corner Border Blocks** 

Finished Size: 4" x 4" Unfinished Size: 4.5' x 4.5'

Make 4



**Border Blocks** 

4" x 4" 4.5" x 4.5" **Make 48** 

Cut (or Pull from Scrap Stash):

## For Corner Border Blocks:

Dark or Medium Fabrics (whichever you like best for your quilt corner borders):

\*(4) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles [Or, pull (2) 5" squares & trim ½" off one side and cut into (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles]; OR, if you have 2.5" "strips" of fabric, cut rectangles from your strips.

\*(4) 2.5" squares

\*(8) 1.5" squares.

**Light Fabrics**: (8) 1.5" squares.

# For Border Blocks:

Medium or Dark Fabrics (whichever you like best for your quilt border):  $(48)\ 2.5$ " x 4.5" rectangles [Or, pull  $(24)\ 5$ " squares & trim  $\frac{1}{2}$ " off one side and cut each square into  $(2)\ 2.5$ " x 4.5" rectangles], OR simply use 2.5" strips of fabric if you have them.




Dark or Medium (whichever you like best for your quilt): (192) 1.5" squares; OR, use 1.5" strips of fabric

Light Fabrics: (192) 1.5" squares OR use 1.5" strips of fabric

# Outside Border if you would like to include it on your quilt:

Medium or Dark fabrics: Cut (2) 1.5" x 56.5" borders and (2) 1.5" x 58.5" borders.

This Border is very versatile; have fun with the value/color selection.



#### **Directions:**

The pattern calls for creating "4-patch checkerboard units" for the borders. If you have 1.5" Strips and would like to create Strip Sets for your checkerboard borders, that would be a quick method of doing so. If you are not using strip sets, you will simply be sewing scrappy 1.5" squares together to create a stunning checkerboard in your border! (MQ Part 3 Video will demonstrate how to create strip sets using strips of fabric.)

"Scrappy" checkerboards with darks, mediums and lights give interest to the border. OR, you can simply use a Dark and a Light, OR a Medium and a Light fabric to create your Checkerboard units.

Note: There are many short-cut methods of creating this border, but this pattern will demonstrate sewing the 4-patch checkerboard to 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles.

You could, however, simply create long rows of 4-patch checkerboards and attach them to a long rectangle of 2.5" strip of fabric which measures the width of your quilt center! "Sew" many options!

### **Corner Border Blocks:**

Using your choice of either a Dark or Medium 2.5" square, sew a 4-patch checkerboard unit to the 2.5" square. Then sew the resulting unit to a 2.5" x 4.5" rectangle. (Follow diagram at right.)



Press seams to the darker side whenever possible. Square up the Corner Border block to 4.5" square. MAKE 4 of these Corner Blocks.

#### **Border Blocks:**

Create 4-patch checkerboard units using your 1.5" squares or using 1.5" strip sets. Again, Scrappy checkerboards with darks, mediums and lights give interest to the border. OR, you can simply use a Dark and Light, OR a Medium and Light fabrics to create your Checkerboard units.

Be sure ALL your individual "4-patch checkerboards" square up to 2.5". When you sew (2) "4-patch checkerboards" **together**, they should measure **2.5**" **x 4.5**".

**To Create the Border Block:** Sew (2) 4-patch checkerboards to a 2.5" x 4.5" Medium (or Dark- your preference) Rectangle as shown at right...



Make a total of (48) of these **border blocks** for the wall-size guilt.

- 1. Sew (12) units of your Border Blocks together to create a Border. (See diagram above.) Make (4) borders.
- 2. Sew (2) of the borders to the opposite sides of the quilt.
- 3. Then, sew a "Corner Border Block" unit to each end of the **remaining** (2)

borders. (See diagrams of borders at right...)



4. Sew the (2) borders from Step 3 to the remaining sides of the quilt.

If you would like to add "outer" borders, sew (2) 1.5" x 56.5" borders to opposite sides of the quilt.

Then sew (2) 1.5" x 58.5" borders to the remaining sides of the quilt.

Your "Winds of Time" quilt is finished and ready to be quilted, bound and labeled!
