“My Honeybee!” Scrappy Block 12.5” x 12.5”

Fabric scraps to pull from your stash:

For EACH block, pull or cut:

Lights: (4) 2.5” squares, (4) 3.5” squares

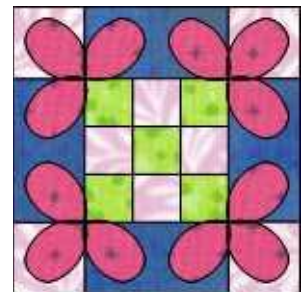
Mediums: (5) 2.5” squares; (12) 3” squares for applique flowers

Darks: either 3.5” strips of fabric sub-cut into (4) 6.5” x 3.5” rectangles

OR (2) 7” squares cut in half, then trim off ½” from length to obtain (4) 6.5” x 3.5” rectangles.

Create block:

1. Create the 9-patch for center of the block with the (4) 2.5” lights & (5) 2.5” mediums (follow diagram of block center).
 - a. Press & square up the 9-patch to 6.5”.
2. Prepare (4) 6.5” x 3.5” dark rectangles by either sub-cutting 3.5” strips **OR** cutting (2) 7” squares in half & trimming of ½” from length to obtain a total of (4) 6.5” x 3.5” rectangles.
3. Sew a Dark 6.5” x 3.5” rectangle to EACH SIDE of the 9-patch. Press to the dark. (This is **Row 2.**)
4. Sew the remaining (2) Dark 6.5” x 3.5” rectangles between (2) 3.5” Light squares to create **Row 1** and **Row 3.**
5. **Sew the block together in 3 rows:** Follow the diagram above.
6. Press the block.
7. **Prepare the Applique Flower petals** using fusible applique... simply draw the petal shape (12) times on the paper side of the fusible and then fuse to the wrong side of the (12) 3” Medium squares.
 - a. Cut out the petals on the line.
 - b. Fuse the petals onto the block following the diagram above.
 - c. Applique each petal in place according to diagram.
8. Square up the block to 12.5”.

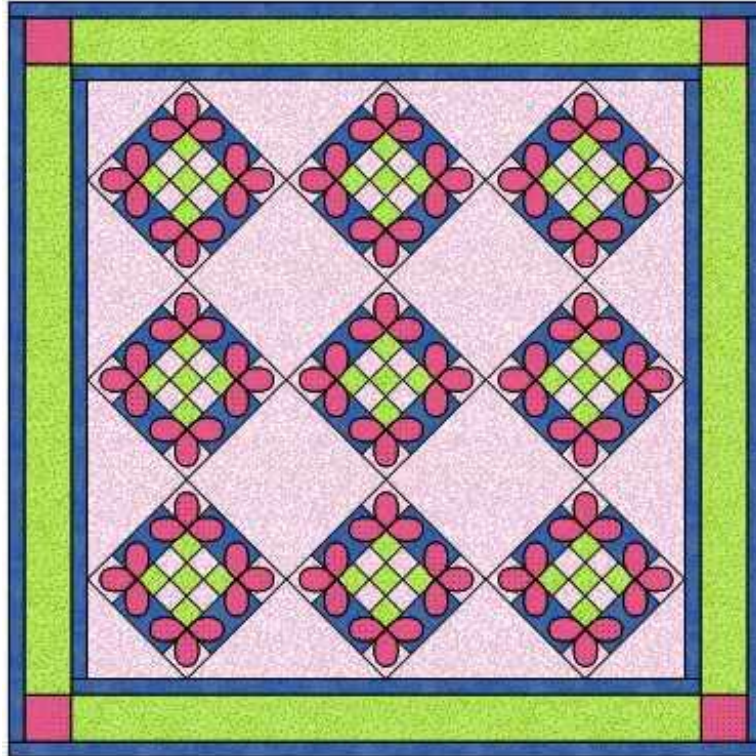


Your “*My Honeybee!*” Block is ready to use!
