# "Irish Chain" Scrappy Block 12.5" x 12.5"

## Fabric scraps to pull from your stash:

For **EACH** block, pull or cut:

**Lights**: (16) 2" squares, (4) 4" squares (HST's & Snowball units)

Mediums: (16) 2" squares


Darks: (1) 5" square; (2) 4" Squares (HST's)

### **Create block:**

- 1. Create a total of (8) 4-patch units for the block with the (16) 2" lights & (16) 2" mediums (follow diagram of block).
  - a. Press & square up each 4-patch unit to 3.5".
- 2. Prepare (4) HST units using (2) of the 4" Light squares & (2) 4" Dark squares. Place a Light 4" square RST with a 4" Dark square. Draw a diagonal line. Sew scant 1/4" on EACH side of diagonal line. Cut apart on diagonal line. Press to the dark side. SQUARE UP EACH HST unit to 3.5".
- 3. For CENTER of the block, create a snowballed square-in-a-square unit. Cut the remaining (2) 4" Light squares once diagonally to create (4) Triangles. Press a crease in the middle of the resulting triangles. TRIM the 5" square down to 4.75" square & then press a crease in the middle of all four sides of the 4.75" Dark square. Match crease of a triangle with the center crease of the square... sew \(^14\)" SA. (Watch Video!). Do this on all 4 sides of the Dark Square. Press and square up the square-in-a-square unit to 6.5."
- 4. **Sew the block together**: Follow the diagram and be sure to orient each unit within each row in the correct position to create the Scrappy Irish Chain block

- 5. Press the block.
- 6. Square up the block to 12.5."
