“Memorial Day” Scrappy Block 12.5” x 12.5”

Fabric scraps to pull from your stash:

Lights: (8) 1.5” squares; (2) 1.5” x 8.5” strips; (4) 1.5” x 12.5” strips

Blues: (8) 1.5” squares;

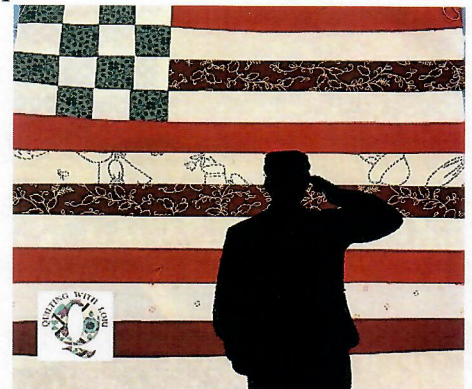
Reds: (2) 1.5” x 8.5” strips; (4) 1.5” x 12.5” strips

Black: approx. 8” square (soldier)

Fusible webbing: 8” square (Lite SAS2 or SoftFuse, Lite Heat’n’bond or similar brand, etc.)

Create the Block:

1. Piece the 16-patch together using (8) 1.5” Lights and (8) 1.5” Blue squares. Press the SA’s to the dark. Square up the 16-patch unit to 4.5”.
2. Piece the 1.5” x 8.5” light and red strips together. Press the SA to the dark.
3. Sew the 8.5” striped unit to the 16-patch square unit.
4. Piece the (4) 1.5” x 12.5” Light strips to the (4) 1.5” x 12.5” Red strips.
5. Press SA’s to the dark.
6. Sew the bottom 12.5” striped unit to the top 4.5” x 12.5” square/striped unit.
7. Press the SA’s to the dark when possible.
8. Square up the block to 12.5”.



Create the Soldier applique:

1. Trace the PDF of the soldier to the paper-side of fusible web.
2. Loosely cut around the traced fusible web.
3. Press the traced unit to the WRONG side of Black fabric square.
4. Once cool, cut out the fused unit ON the traced line.
5. Remove the paper backing.
6. Place the soldier on the block. (I placed mine so that the bottom was in the ¼” SA at the bottom of the block. (See photo above.)
7. Once you are happy with the location of the soldier on the block, Press.
8. Applique around the soldier using black thread. (I simply edge-stitched my blocks!)

Your “*Memorial Day*” Block is ready to use!
