"Let's Dig!" Scrappy Block 12.5" x 12.5"

Fabric scraps to pull from your stash:

To create the TWO blocks:

Lights: (2) 6.5" squares (greens); (2) 7" squares HST's (greens) **Mediums:** (1) 6.5" square (red); (1) 7" square HST's (red) **Darks:** (1) 6.5" square (black); (1) 7" square HST's (black)





Create the Block:

- 1. Create the HST's first by pairing (1) Light (green) 7" square with (1) Medium (red) 7" square; and then (1) Light (green) 7" square with (1) Dark (black) 7" square. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner; sew a Scant ¼" SA on EACH side of the Drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press SA to the dark. Square up EACH HST unit to 6.5" square. You will end up with (2) Green/Red HST units and (2) Green/Black HST units.
- 2. Piece the "Let's Dig" Blocks together in a 4-patch unit as shown using the 6.5" HST units and the 6.5" Light (green), Dark (black) & Medium (red) squares. NOTE: Be sure to orient the HST units properly within the block.



- 3. Once sewn together, press & square up the block to 12.5".
- 4. For the "Let's Dig" quilt, make (11) of EACH of the blocks. Arrange them as shown on the quilt. (Shown on page 2 of this PDF.)
- 5. Add a Border or Borders! Gift the quilt to your favorite child who loves to use his backhoe to dig holes in the yard!
