



Part Four: Flying Geese Block

Sampler Quilt Beginner Quilt Class 2023

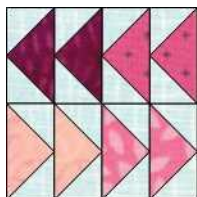
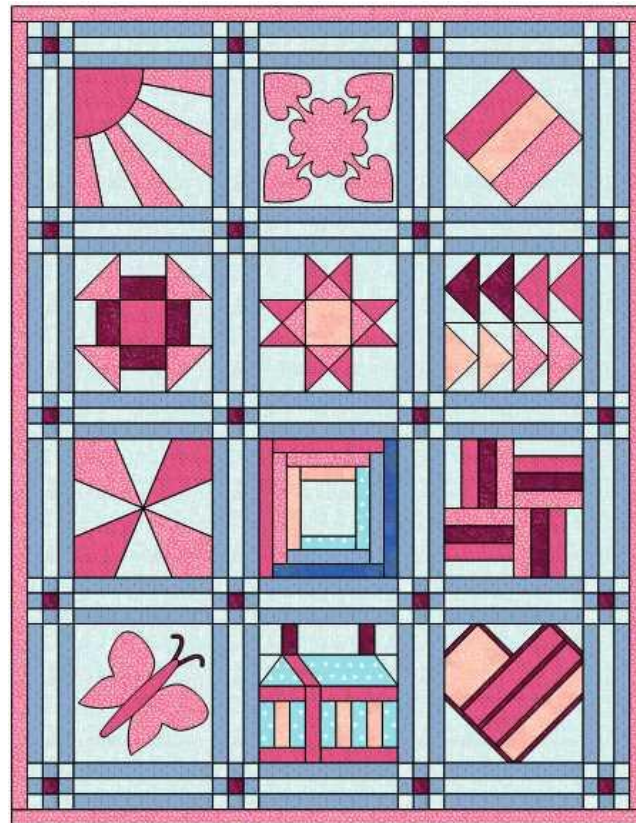
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Quilt Size: 53" x 41"

Block Size: 9" (finished size in quilt)

Cornerstones: 3" (finished)

Sashing: 3" x 12" (finished)



“Flying Geese Block” (9.5” x 9.5” unfinished block size)

Fabric Requirements for the Quilt:

Background (Light blue): 1 – ¼ yards

Bright blue: 1/8 yard

Medium pink (B): ½ yard

Backing: 2 yards

Medium blue (A): 1/8 yard

Light pink: 3/8 yard

Dark pink: 1/8 yard

Binding: ½ yard

Medium blue (B): 7/8 yard

Medium pink (A): 7/8 yard

Batting: Approx. 60” x 45”



Cutting:

(Always substitute the color of fabrics you plan to use for those listed below...)

Light Blue background: (8) 3-1/4” squares

Light Pink: (2) 3-1/4” squares

Medium Pink A: (2) 3-1/4” squares

Medium Pink B: (2) 3-1/4” squares

Dark Pink: (2) 3-1/4” squares

Directions:

1. The simplest way to make Flying Geese units is to create HST’s and put matching pairs together to create the Flying Geese! So...
2. Let’s create HST units as follows: Place a Light Blue 3-1/4” square RST with each of the Light Pink, Medium Pink A, Medium Pink B and Dark Pink 3-1/4” squares. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner of each pair. Sew a scant 1/4” SA (seam allowance) on EACH side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press the Seams to the darker side. Square up EACH HST unit to 2.75” square.
3. Then, create the Flying Geese block by sewing the rows together as follows (NOTE: Be sure to orient EACH HST unit within each row properly ... Follow the diagram of the rows below):



Row One: HST Units (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Dk Pink; (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Med PinkA



Row Two: HST Units (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Dk Pink; (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Med PinkA



Row Three: HST Units (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Lt Pink; (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Med PinkB



Row Four: HST Units (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Lt Pink; (2) Lt. Bkgrd/Med PinkB

4. Once the Block has been sewn together. Press the SA’s of each row to one side. Follow the video tutorial.
5. **Then, SQUARE up the block to 9.5” square.**

Congratulations! The “Flying Geese” block is finished!
