If you don't already have your scrap stash cut, sorted, organized and ready to go to make beautiful quilts, be sure to watch/listen to my YouTube video tutorial here: LINK_This link will take you to my YouTube channel and you'll find the tutorial is that top video listed on the channel right under my QWL Welcome banner.

If you do NOT have a scrap stash, NO WORRIES! All my patterns offer yardage to create the quilt. The yardage required for *Dutchman's Crossing* is listed below. PLUS, I have available some Resource Links on my website to give you some wonderful fabric options from which to choose: Check out the Strawberry Lemonade fabric line on <u>The Fat Quarter Shop</u>; or the True Blue fabric line on <u>Connecting Threads</u>.

<u>Fabric requirements for 90" x 90" quilt size:</u> Light fabric: 2.25 yards (mine will be creams) Medium 1 fabric: 2-3/8 yards (mine will be soft greens) Medium 2 fabric: 2-1/8 yards (mine will be soft roses) Dark fabric: 2-5/8 yards (mine will be blacks/charcoals)

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Border One:

Note: Fabric colors indicated in the block image are only suggestions! Create your own unique quilt blocks; scrappy or themed! Use scrap fabrics or fabric lines that please you!



Make 28 Border Block: Size: 9.5" x 9.5" (unfinished)

Pull from your scraps, OR cut from yardage:
(28) Medium #1 (Greens) 5.5" squares
(28) Medium #2 (Pinks) 5.5" squares
(112) Light (Whites) *2.75" squares (*Pull 3" squares from stash & trim)
(56) Medium #2 (Pinks) *2.75" squares
(56) Dark (Blacks) *2.75" squares

Also: Pull (8) 1.5" x 9.5" Darks (Blacks)

For EACH Border Block:

<u>Create 4-patch units</u> for the block as shown in diagram at right using: For EACH block use (2) Light (Whites) 2.75" squares, (2) Med #2 (Pinks) 2.75" squares, (2) Darks (Blacks) 2.75" squares. Create a total of (56) of these 4-patch units. Square up EACH unit to 5."

<u>Create HST's</u>: Place Med #1 & Med #2 RST; draw a diagonal line; sew scant ¹/₄" on EACH side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line. Press open & square up EACH HST to 5" Square. Create a total of (56) HST's.

Lay out the block in 2 rows using the HST's and the 4-patch units. (Follow diagram below.)



NOTE the orientation of each 4-patch & HST within the block.

Make a total of (28) Border Blocks; Square up EACH block to 9.5".

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Top & Bottom Border Blocks:

Sew (6) Border blocks together, along with (2) 1.5" x 9.5" Black strips on EACH end. NOTE the orientation of each block... it creates a chevron. Be sure to rotate each block within the top and bottom border to create the chevron. Add the 1.5" black strips on each end and then...

Sew the top and bottom borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center.





Top Border



Side Borders:

Sew (6) Border blocks together, along with (2) 1.5" x 9.5" Black strips on EACH end. THEN, sew a corner block on each end of the border as shown in diagram below.

Note the orientation of each block... again, it creates a chevron. I recommend using a design wall or the floor to audition your blocks before sewing them together.



Once you've sewn the complete Side borders together (including the black strips and the corner blocks), attach them to the sides of the quilt.

IMPORTANT:

Next week, we will work on the Wall Quilt Borders and the last Pieced Border rows for the Queen size quilt.

If you are making the Wall Quilt, you have a week to catch up on your piecing!
